(do not fit these strings to an acoustic wooden ukulele, they will pull it out of shape!)

These gauges are for a light set, which is what I prefer, when using a low G.
Can re-calculate for a heavier set, but, if a ukulele only player who has only been used to nylon strings were to opt for the heavier set first, he/she may find that the finger tips will be very sore for some time.

Have,nt tried light strings for High G tuning

So cannot comment, only to say “when the finger tips bleed, you are getting somewhere”
